

# BLESSED VISIT TO KENYA

In Nov. I had the privilege to visit Kenya again. A couple from Alingsås in Sweden, Karl-Gustav and Karin Westerdahl accompanied me on the tour. During two weeks we had a great time together in the country where we started the mission work more than 40 years ago.



We flew from Nairobi to Migori in a small MAF-plane. It was quite an experience. It took just 1 hour and 20 minutes. In Migori we were warmly received by our new gen. overseer John Absai together with a team.

The first week we held our annual Leadership seminar with more than 80 participants. My subject this year was “Strategic Church Growth”. I emphasised on strategic prayer, strategic evangelism and strategic discipleship training. The anointing was great and I was overwhelmed by the presence of God in our seminar. The last day we anointed all leaders with oil and prayed for them. They left the seminar with a new might touch of God upon their lives and ministries.

On Sunday we had a wonderful meeting at Migori Gospel Centre. Karl-Gustav and Karin went round and visited the poor children they are sponsoring and they came back every day deeply moved by what they had seen. It resulted in adding five more poor children for sponsorship, so now they are sponsoring ten children.

We spent one day at Komotobo, where we visited the health centre, the orphanage and the centre for handicapped children. We were very glad to see that

the institutions are cared for in a good way. The handicapped centre had received five new wheelchairs. It's with joy and thankfulness we can return to the place where the mission started and we find it's still flourishing with activities.

It was filled up with people from the surrounding area. It was a great service with such a heavenly worship and joy. Karl-Gustav and Karin testified and I preached about "God's original intention with man."

So many came forward for special prayer. It was with great satisfaction in our hearts we caught the flight to Amsterdam on Sunday evening. All the glory belongs to God.
